Amoco cancers linked

For the first time, Amoco acknowledged Thursday that six of its scientists may have gotten deadly brain cancer from their jobs in the mid-1970s and early 1980s, though the exact cause remains a mystery.

"The study ultinately was not able to point a tinger at any specific substance or any specific process," said Jim Lovry, chairman of the BP Amoco task force investigating the cause of the cancers. "There's a pattern that appears to be work-related."

The men were exposed to ionizing radiation and n-Hexane, a solvent, but Amoco investigators said those substances should not have led to the intracranial tumors.

Investigators have also concluded there is no link between the research center and cancers coveloped by more than a dozen others. m Details, Page 8
